



Greetings from Rocky Mountain Ministries Montana!

Who We Are

Our ministry began in 1999 when three friends felt the call to enter the medical and Christian mission field in Central America. They were blessed with a generous gift from a single donor to support the ministry, sending the first four mission trips to Honduras, and the next sixteen years to the Guaymas-San Carlos area of Central Mexico. In recent years, Rocky Mountain Ministries has evolved into mostly medical related volunteers traveling to Mexico, serving smaller Yaqui villages or impoverished areas of larger communities. The core group of the medical team consists of 24-35 volunteers, including doctors, nurses, a physical therapist, pharmacists, EMT's, and other support personnel.

More Than Medical Care

While the mission team provides greatly needed medical care, demonstrating the love of Jesus Christ in Mexico is a top priority. We partner with a local church during the visit who provides translators, support personnel, and an evangelical station. They also serve as a church connection to support the local people after the mission team returns home. A children's program is also conducted during the clinic hours.

A Life-Changing Response

By God's grace, the mission team has gained the recognition and trust of the people we serve. Our teams have interacted with the Yaqui people and we have seen a dramatic transformation from them being very quiet, reserved, and stand-offish to being willing to share their lives. Individuals and families return to the clinic setting not only for medical attention, but because it has become a safe place for them to share their needs, fears, hurts, and concerns. Many come specifically for prayer. During one trip, the mission team will interact with an average total of 1200-1400 individuals. It is life-changing for everyone.

Help Us Continue the Mission

The last mission trip concluded in January 2019 and was a great success! As the team met to debrief from the trip, we all felt called to continue this type of medical and spiritual outreach to the people in Mexico. To allow Rocky Mountain Ministries to continue operating, we need donors to support us through financial gifts and resources. While each team member gives of their personal funds to offset their individual travel and lodging expenses, there are many other associated costs. These include: medicines, medical supplies, eye glasses, Bibles, dental supplies, van and bus rentals, and children's ministry supplies.

Each mission trip requires approximately \$30,000 per year to carry out the program and provide necessary supplies. While not all of us are called to serve directly on the mission field, we are all called to share the love of God and care for the poor and hurting in the world. 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A Closer Look at a Mission Trip to Mexico

Before the Rocky Mountain Ministries team arrives in Mexico, trusted locals go out and talk with some of the communities they have formed relationships with to decide where the biggest needs are and where the medical team might have the most significant impact. Each day of the mission trip, the team visits a new site. Many of the sites visited in a trip are the same year to year, but there are usually two to three new ones. This gives us the opportunity to start new relationships and minister to different groups. It is an effective way to provide for the physical needs of the people but also the spiritual and emotional ones as well.

During the January 2019 mission trip at our first site on Mexican soil, we set up in a new area where the police chief had been shot and killed the night before. As tragic as this was, five of the local police officers came to us in two different groups quite broken and wanting prayer. Members of our team prayed with them and listened to their stories. This single event brought three of them to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

At another site, a little 4-year-old girl was brought to the clinic and it looked like she was in the process of dying from pneumonia. The doctors did what they could for her, including an injection of an antibiotic, but it became apparent that the nearly unconscious girl would not live long. Being in a rural area there was no ambulance available, we prayed over her and decided to drive the little girl and her mother to nearest hospital about an hour away. Prior to arriving at the hospital, she was sitting up and talking. Miracle? Most definitely! It was a blessing to many who knew the little girl and a testimony to the power of prayer. In addition to transporting the girl and her mother to the hospital, we were able to give the mother some money for the hospital stay and enough for a few nights lodging for herself, where she could be near her daughter. Our team was overjoyed to have the resources available to help this family.

These are just two stories from one mission trip, but these two incidents relate the powerful impact that Rocky Mountain Ministries has had not only on specific people, but those that are family, friends, or bystanders that witness the love and caring attitude that the group shares.
